Since 1933, JLT has been at the forefront of tackling many of the region's toughest, most pressing problems. We assess community assets and needs, develop strategic partnerships, raise critical funds, manage projects and events and empower women with the leadership skills to change lives. We also host fun social events that allow our members to network and build lasting relationships.



COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

For more than 85 years, JLT volunteers have significantly impacted the Greater Toledo area by developing long-term initiatives and programs. These initiatives and programs have met our community's ever-changing needs.

JLT has a rich history. Past members' efforts were instrumental in starting the Ronald McDonald House, Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) program for abused and neglected children, the Toledo Museum of Art docent program and the Aurora Project house for women and children.

Our community initiatives are Issued Based Community Impact (IBCI) projects. IBCI leverages the community and civic leadership skills of League members to address issues faced by our community. The goal of this approach is to meet community needs with meaningful and sustainable solutions. Throughout the years, this specific focus has changed in reaction to community needs, which has brought us to our current focus area of women and children in poverty. Within the IBCI framework, we can educate members in our focus area while also working to incorporate diversity and inclusion principles.







Our members, focused on community impact, organize short-term, hyper-local projects to benefit the community. These are called "Service Learning Projects". Projects include assembling bagged meals and organizing food drives and small projects in support of our community partners.



The Junior League of Toledo has established "As We Grow," a diaper bank that addresses the diaper need in Lucas County. It's estimated that 1 in 3 American families experience diaper need. In Lucas County, the need is great—with recent figures in the Ohio Poverty Report 2019 of a poverty level at 19.8%, which is the highest in the state. Babies without clean diapers are exposed to more potential health risks. They are less likely to be accepted to daycares, leaving parents unable to attend work.

The Junior League of Toledo will be raising money, as well as procuring diapers, wipes and diaper rash cream donations from the community to directly benefit their community partners, who will distribute the supplies to clients who have diaper need.

VOLUNTARISM AND COMMUNITY IMPACT

JLT is committed to building a better community through voluntarism. Over the past 85 years, JLT has sponsored and/or collaborated on over 100 community projects. As a member, you will have many opportunities to serve on projects in the community and JLT.

We are committed to developing the potential of women. As a member, you will be able to participate in both formal and informal leadership training opportunities. Additionally, you may have a chance to facilitate a training session based on your areas of professional development and expertise. Several of our active and past members have attended Junior League-sponsored state, regional and national conferences and development seminars and training sessions.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

JLT offers hands-on and formal leadership opportunities. You can learn many of the requisite skills to become a change agent in your community and develop managerial and team leadership skills outside of the workplace. Many Junior League members eventually serve on community boards, lead nonprofit organizations, lead professional groups or hold elected office.

JLT will connect you to a diversely talented network of empowered leaders working to create significant community change. MEMBERSHIP

NEW MEMBER COURSE REQUIREMENT

New members must:

- Be a woman who is at least 21 years of age
- Reside within 50 miles of Toledo
- Have an interest in voluntarism
- Meet the financial and time commitment of the New Member Program (see below)
